BOARD REPORT

It is with pleasure that we present the Annual Report and Financial Accounts of Manly 16ft Skiff Sailing Club for the year ending 30th April 2019. This year has seen a record profit of \$1,941,174, further strengthening the club's financial position; with a closing cash reserve of \$7,661,813.

The financial results were very pleasing considering the significant investment the club will be making shortly in the St George venue. There are many people who contributed to these outstanding results, specifically the Board would like to acknowledge and thank our Secretary Manager Matt Hazell, and the entire team, working at both the Manly and St George venues, for their dedication and commitment throughout the year.

Across both venues combined, we saw our trading result increase by 20.6% with the club continuing to focus on managing the venues and delivering market leading products and services to our members and their quests.

At St George, John Tsambouniaris and his team continue to do an amazing job and minimise losses, while facing significant hurdles with a large portion of the club being cordoned off due to structural issues. We are very lucky to have such a dedicated and committed team looking after our members down south.

On a positive side for the St George venue, at the time of writing this report, the Development Application for the new club has been approved and final documents and pricing will be finalised in the coming month. The board are hopeful of a 2019 start to the construction and hopefully opening 1st half 2021.

Detailed results of all the club's sailing classes in the recent season are contained in the appropriate areas of the Annual Report so I won't repeat them. I would however like to congratulate all the club's sailors, volunteers, sponsors and supporters for a fantastic season. The club achieved many successes across both Manly and St George fleets, including multiple Australian championships, and we are confident of continuing these results into the future.

Finally, the Board would like to sincerely thank all members for your continued patronage of the club. The board, management and staff are looking forward to another year of providing you with the best possible experience at both the Manly 16ft Skiff Sailing Club and St George Sailing Club.

Whilst there was a very good level of participation in all the classes and also a very high and commendable standard of results, as pointed out by Dave Burkett in his Junior Chairman Report, we still need to continually work on additional initiatives to bring new kids into both of our clubs.

One such initiative at Manly in 2018/19 was the launching of the Children's Learn to Sail classes by Niall Powers on Sunday mornings. The course attracted 11 kids, who engaged in a 12-week sailing programme. Of the 11, we have 4 seeking crew positions, and a few interested in participating in LTS a second time. Due to the success of LTS, we are considering expanding the programme to include a second group next season.

Of pleasing note at Manly is the continued transition between Juniors and Seniors with a number of our sailors into the 13 and 16 fleets. As the 13ft skiff fleet continues to establish itself at St George, we are also confident that we will see some of these sailors transition through the 16's within the next season or two.

This season saw the retirement of St George sailing stalwart Glenn "Foot" York. After 51 continuous seasons of sailing in 16ft skiffs, Glenn has decided to hang up his sailing boots and graduate to rescue boat duties. Glenn competed very successfully at the Championship level in his earlier years as a skipper and crew on various skiffs, with the pinnacle being a State Championship victory in 1984/85 as the skipper of "Coleman Signs". He is truly one of the Class legends.

In closing, I would again like to thank my Vice-Commodore Andrew St John for his support and dedication to the Club. My thanks and appreciation also go to Sailing Secretary James Bury at Manly, St George Captain Luka Damic and also Sailing Administration Managers Michael McMahon (Manly) and Jack Andrew (St George) for all their logistical and administration work. The good news is that we will be adding these wind breaks to the southern and western sides of the deck in the next month or two which will allow it to be continually enjoyed in even more weather conditions.

Service wise, Sunday breakfast has continued to grow throughout the year and if you haven't tried it yet, make sure you do so soon.

Down the road at St George, we have taken another step towards the new club coming to fruition. The old clubhouse closed on the 20th of August to make way for the builders and if everything goes to plan, we hope to be opening the doors to our brand-new facility down there in late 2020 or early 2021. A special mention must go to our St George Manager John Tsambouniaris and his team, along with our caterer Helen and her team, for all the time and effort they have put in over the last almost nine years to get us to this point. There were a few mixed emotions when the old club closed its doors for the last time, however everyone is extremely excited and cannot wait for the new club to arrive.

The financial reports cover Manly 16ft Skiff Sailing Club Limited as an individual entity. Manly 16ft Skiff Sailing Club Limited is a for not-for-profit company limited by guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

The functional and presentation currency of Manly 16ft Skiff Sailing Club Limited is Australian dollars. The financial report was authorised for issue by the Directors on 15th August, 2019. Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the Corporations Act 2001. The company is a not for profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated costs of completion and the costs necessary to make the sale. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less. where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment of losses.

Plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are measured using the cost model.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, is depreciated on a straight line basis over the assets useful life to the Company, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

Leased assets and leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or their estimated useful life.

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all of the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses on a straight line basis over the life of the lease term.

Financial Instruments

Financial instruments are recognised initially using trade date accounting, i.e. on the date that company becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial instruments are measured at fair value plus transaction costs (except for instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss where transaction costs are expensed as incurred).

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market. They arise principally through the provision of goods and services to customers but also incorporate other types of contractual monetary assets.

After initial recognition these are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. Any change in their value is recognised in profit or loss.

The company's trade and most other receivables fall into this category of financial instruments. In some circumstances, the company renegotiates repayment terms with customers which may lead to changes in the timing of the payments, the company does not necessarily consider the balance to be impaired, however assessment is made on a case-by-case basis.

Available-for-sale financial assets

Available-for-sale financial assets are non-derivative financial assets that do not qualify for inclusion in any of the other categories of financial assets or which have been designated in this category.

The Club does not hold any available-for-sale financial assets.

Financial liabilities

The company's financial liabilities include borrowings, trade and other payables (including finance lease liabilities), which are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the company determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.

Intangibles

Goodwill

Goodwill is carried at cost less accumulated impairment losses.

Goodwill - testing for impairment

Goodwill is tested annually for impairment and carried at cost less accumulated impairment losses. Gains and losses on the disposal of an entity include the carrying amount of goodwill related to the entity sold.

Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Employee benefits are presented as current liabilities in the statement of financial position if the company does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting date regardless of the classification of the liability for measurement purposes.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the company has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured at the present value of management's best estimate of the outflow required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting year.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the company and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depends on whether the outcome of the services can be measured reliably. If this is the case then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period. If the outcome cannot be reliably measured then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

Other income

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the company is entitled to it.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

Comparative Amounts

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

Where a change in comparatives has also affected the opening retained earnings previously presented in a comparative period, an opening statement of financial position at the earliest date of the comparative period has been presented.

New Accounting Standards for Application in Future Periods

The AASB has issued a number of new and amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations that have mandatory application dates for future reporting periods, some of which are relevant to the company. The company has decided to adopt the new standards when they become mandatory with the exception of the reduced disclosure framework.
