Gentlemen,

In submitting for you consideration and adoption, this 30th Annual Report and Balance Sheet, your Management Committee does so with a feeling of pride and satisfaction.

The season completed has proved an outstanding one in many aspects. The standard of racing was among the highest ever attained in Manly, and the Club ambition of extending the clubhouse for social amenities has been achieved.

BOAT REGISTRATION

A total of 15 boats - 8. 16ft Skiffs, 3. 12fters, 3. V.J's and 1. Vee Ess were registered for the season.

The 16ft Skiffs on the register were - "Atom", "Encourage", "Enterprise", "Nor-Easter", "Scamp", "Storm", and "Success".

The 12fter Registrations were - "Ixion", "Varuna", "Y. Too". The V.J. Registrations were - "Adonis", "Corbeau", "Ika" The Vee Ess Registration was "Domino".

The Manly Sailing Club conducted races for the 16ft Skiffs only. The other craft were registered on condition that they raced with the North Harbour Club.
MEMBERSHIP

Active membership was - Seniors 51, Juniors 15.

Rising costs necessitated an increase in Senior Membership Fees from 1 to 2 guineas. Whilst the increase was considered excessive by some members, it must be remembered that the shed rent still remains the same, thus boat owners now enjoy the lowest shed rent of any 16fters Club.

Whilst there has been a decrease in the senior membership for the season, it is reassuring to note the increase in the number of juniors in our Club.

CLUB RACES

Enthusiasm and sportmanship were the outstanding attributes of the season's racing. Close finishes, equitable distribution of trophies, and an even point score, evidenced the conscientious endeavours of the handicapping committee.

The Club Championship was decided over the usual three heats. It was won by J.G.Graham's "Success" with three firsts.

Our congratulations are due to J.G.Graham and the crew on their excellent sailing in winning the title in this new Uffa Fox designed skiff.

Honours for the most improved skiff of the season, once again go to the "Atom". As new-comers to the sailing sphere the three Alston brothers have again this season, made an outstanding contribution to the sailing standard of the Manly Sailing Club.

Lyons), "Pilot"(J. Muston), "Return"(J. O'Rourke), "Nemo" (J. Brown).

The respective placings for this event were "Encourage", "Return", "C.J.O.", "Success", "Nemo", "Scamp", and "Storm".

To our good neighbours from the Spit, we once again extend our congratulations.

MANLY REGATTA

This event again attracted one of the notable fleets of the year, when 45 starters faced the starter. The race was started in a light Nor-easter, to finish in a strong Westerly breeze.

Our congratulations go to "Alert" from the Port Jackson Club. Mr. Buckle has been successful in winning the "Ivanhoe Trophy" for two successive years. Fastest time for this event was recorded by "Return" (E.Parsons).
